Value: As a rough estimate of this coins value you can assume this coin in average condition will be valued at somewhere around \$14, while one in mint state (MS) condition could bring \$75 at auction if certified. This price does not reference any standard coin grading scale. So when we say average, we mean worn as would be expected from a coin in this age, and mint state meaning MS+ grade and certified*.

Silver Content: 90%

Extra Info: The US government produced just 2.5 million Benjamin Franklin Silver Half Dollars in 1955. This may not sound that crazy unless you look back just one year. In 1954 they made more than 40,000,000 thats 40 million. So if you can get a 1955 even in poor condition its worth some money. The rare FBL (Full Bell Line) versions of the Franklin Half Dollar are worth between

\$30 and \$300 depending upon overall grade and quality of bell lines. Bugs Bunny Franklin Half Dollars are present and are worth just slightly more than the original. Called Bugs Bunny because of an error that makes Franklin look to have rabbit teeth.
