Value: As a rough estimate of this coins value you can assume this coin in average condition will be valued at somewhere around 50 cents, while one in mint state (MS) condition could bring \$7 at auction if certified. This price does not reference any standard coin grading scale. So when we say average, we mean worn as would be expected from a coin in this age, and mint state meaning MS+ grade and certified*.

Extra Info: S stands for San Francisco, but it may just as well stand for proof. Kennedy Half Dollar from 1971 to present with S mint marks are proofs. With just over 3 million of these coins issued the 1971 S Half Dollar was the rarest for the year. This was the first year that the US Mint issued Kennedy Half Dollars in a non silver state. Anything after 1970 contains no silver. These coins

are a copper-nickel composition, being a nickel jacket over a copper core.
