**Value:** As a rough estimate of this coins value you can assume this coin in average condition will be valued at somewhere around \$12, while one in mint state (MS) condition could bring \$270 at auction if certified. This price does not reference any standard coin grading scale. So when we say average, we mean worn as would be expected from a coin in this age, and mint state meaning MS+ grade and certified\*.

**Face Value:** 0.50 USD

**Total Produced:** 18,215,000 \*\*

**Silver Content:** 90%

**Extra Info:** 75% of the Half Dollars issued in the year 1960 were Ben Franklins minted in Denver. The mint mark is on the reverse above the liberty bell. Many coins sold with FBL (full bell lines). If the lines are struck and clean on the bell then the coin is worth much 2x, 3x, maybe even 4x the listed high price.
