Value: As a rough estimate of this coins value you can assume this coin in average condition will be valued at somewhere around \$3, while one in mint state (MS) condition could bring \$12 at auction if certified. This price does not reference any standard coin grading scale. So when we say average, we mean worn as would be expected from a coin in this age, and mint state meaning MS+ grade and certified*.

Extra Info: On the 1960 90% Silver Franklin D. Roosevelt look for the double die obverse it is worth around \$355.00! The double die is on the front, and is evident in the JS initials to the left of the date. These are rare, how many were issued in error? Who knows? There are also proofs issued at this (p) mint to look out for, and they are worth somewhere in the neighborhood of \$3 each. The

1960 (p) dime is worth remembering to double check. Only 30% of the coins minted this year came from the (p) mint.
