This price does not reference any standard coin grading scale. So when we say average, we mean worn as would be expected from a coin in this age, and mint state meaning MS+ grade and certified*.

It has a cows head, an ear of corn and some cheese in a

round. It also has the word forward on there, but im not sure what that references. All the state quarters have the words E Pluribus Unum on the reverse bottom middle.
