Value: As a rough estimate of this coins value you can assume this coin in average condition will be valued at somewhere around 25 cents, while one in mint state (MS) condition could bring \$1 at auction if certified. This price does not reference any standard coin grading scale. So when we say average, we mean worn as would be expected from a coin in this age, and mint state meaning MS+ grade and certified*.

Extra Info: Coin was engraved by Don Everhart and was released in January 2005. This coin has a man standing with a walking stick named John Muir a Scottish born naturalist, who may be mistaken as a prospector. It also has the California Condor, half dome, and the works Yosemite Valley. All the state quarters have the words E Pluribus Unum on the reverse bottom middle.
