**Value:** As a rough estimate of this coins value you can assume this coin in average condition will be valued at somewhere around \$8.00, while one in mint state (MS) condition could bring \$95 at auction if certified. This price does not reference any standard coin grading scale. So when we say average, we mean worn as would be expected from a coin in this age, and mint state meaning MS+ grade and certified\*.

**Extra Info:** There have been many double die obverse (front) errors found in the 1937 Washington Quarter minted at the Philadelphia mint. These are worth anywhere from \$750 to \$3,500 each. In addition to errors there are also 5,542 proof coins issued at the mint this year. Those are worth up to \$790 assuming you can find a buyer.
