Value: As a rough estimate of this coins value you can assume this coin in average condition will be valued at somewhere around \$12.50, while one in mint state (MS) condition could bring \$105 at auction if certified. This price does not reference any standard coin grading scale. So when we say average, we mean worn as would be expected from a coin in this age, and mint state meaning MS+ grade and certified*.

Extra Info: Mint mark location on reverse above the Liberty Bell on this Franklin and others. If the mint mark is not present it was minted in Philadelphia. These are the rarest and most valuable of the 1950 Ben Franklins. There were 51,386 proofs minted this year, and they are worth around \$500. The rare FBL (Full Bell Line) versions of the Franklin Half Dollar are worth between \$50 and



\$500 depending upon overall grade.
