Value: As a rough estimate of this coins value you can assume this coin in average condition will be valued at somewhere around \$11.00, while one in mint state (MS) condition could bring \$42 at auction if certified. This price does not reference any standard coin grading scale. So when we say average, we mean worn as would be expected from a coin in this age, and mint state meaning MS+ grade and certified*.

Extra Info: Just 14% of all the Half Dollars minted in 1957 were Ben Franklin (p). Of that 14% just 4% were Proofs. (1.24 million proofs issued). Collectors and coin enthusiasts buy these proofs for around \$25-\$32 The rare FBL (Full Bell Line) versions of the Franklin Half Dollar are worth between \$30 and \$175 depending upon overall grade and quality of bell lines.
