Value: As a rough estimate of this coins value you can assume this coin in average condition will be valued at somewhere around \$12.00, while one in mint state (MS) condition could bring \$58 at auction if certified. This price does not reference any standard coin grading scale. So when we say average, we mean worn as would be expected from a coin in this age, and mint state meaning MS+ grade and certified*.

Silver Content: 90%

Extra Info: Of the 22 million 1963 Silver Ben Franklin Half Dollars issued just 3.07 million proofs were issued. Proofs are selling for somewhere between \$15 and \$23 dollars. This was the final year for the Ben Franklin Half Dollars. The rare FBL (Full Bell Line) versions of the Franklin Half Dollar are worth between \$200 and \$18,000 depending upon overall grade and quality of bell lines.

This makes the FBL versions the 2nd most valuable of the series.
